

WASTE DISPOSAL

CONTAMINATED BROKEN GLASS DISPOSAL PROCEDURES

1. Glass with hazardous chemical residue should be collected as hazardous waste; request an appropriate container from eprograms@gsu.edu
 - Contaminated glassware is **not** to be put in the cardboard broken glass boxes.
2. Label your container with the chemical(s) the glassware is contaminated with (i.e. silica, methanol, chloroform etc.) and the word glass or glassware.
3. Do not allow your container to become over full, you should be able to easily close the lid.
4. Once your container is nearing full please request a pickup and replacement supplies through Chematix <https://chematix.gsu.edu/Chematix/Main> or e-mail eprograms@gsu.edu
